Literacy (speaking and listening) - Drama

Year 5

In years 1 to 6, Literacy does not have end-of-year objectives. However, in year 5 children should be able to:

- Reflect on how working in role helps to explore complex issues.
- Perform a scripted scene making use of dramatic conventions.
- Use and recognise the impact of theatrical effects in drama.

Activities

Role plays -

family life, working life, friends, social activities and children's games.

In groups -

- Perform a section of VFTM using dramatic conventions.
- Using another short script (or one written by themselves) children use a selection of dramatic conventions (2 or 3) to make the scene more powerful/interesting for the audience.
- Children explore the use of theatrical effects in drama, eg. Music, SFX, lighting, costume etc.

Year 6

Students in year 6 should be able to :-

- Improvise using a range of drama strategies and conventions to explore themes.
- Devise a performance considering how to adapt the performance for a specific audience.
- Consider the overall impact of a live or recorded performance, eg. VFTM. They should focus on how drama conventions and strategies can be used to communicate characters, ideas and to build tension.

<u>Literacy (speaking and listening) - Drama</u>

Activities

 Create short improvisations, using a selection of the drama strategies and conventions used in the VFTM play, using the titles:

"The haves and the have nots"

"No choices"

"Dreams v Reality"

"The good old days?"

- Devise a short T.I.E piece on a subject related to the cotton industry or the industrial revolution for a target audience. Either:
 - a) Years 3 and 4
 - or b) Years 8 and 9
 - or c) A group of elderly people.

Consideration should be given to the use of language and presentation techniques for the chosen target audience.

 Children write a short review of a live or recorded performance, eg. VFTM. They should focus on how drama conventions and strategies can be used to communicate ideas, themes, mood and atmosphere, characters, time, place and information.

Suggestions for T.I.E. Presentations.

Target audience: Y3 and Y4.

- Road safety.
- Say no to strangers.
- Litter.
- Saving energy in the home.
- Re-cycling.

Y8 and Y9.

- Bullying.
- Friendship.
- Image.
- Healthy eating.

Elderly audience.

- Bogus callers.
- Home security.
- Stay warm in winter.

Suggestions for role play activities.

In pairs or small groups.
Set your role play in the past or present.

- A teenager has a chance of attending a grammar/good school but his/her parents wont allow him/her to go as they need their wages to supplement the household income.
 STARTING POINT – the teenager opens the letter telling them they have a place at the school.
- A child wants some new shoes for school but so do his/her brothers and sisters.
 STARTING POINT – the child asks his parents for some new shoes.
- A child has an ambition to do something other than a cotton mill worker. STARTING POINT – the child tells his parents about his ambition.
